LUTHERAN WOMEN IN MISSION

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League-New England District \$55,000 Mite Goal has been met and exceeded! All of the Mission Projects have been paid.

Immanuel Lutheran School was given \$4,000 to provide scholarships for children in the community.

Lutheran Friends of the Deaf, Rev. Steven Schumacher, Director,

received \$2,000 to provide a Russian and Russian Sign Language set of Bible Story Books to be distributed through a Hearing and Deaf Ministry at Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chita, Siberia.

LWML MISSION GRANT "I CAN" - SERVING AT-RISK CHILDREN WITH LEARNING NEEDS

The Lutheran Special Education Ministries (LSEM) enrolls youth who are considered academically at-risk in an I CAN Learning Center site hosted by a Lutheran church (or school) located within a low performing public school district. The \$99,000 Scholar-

ship Fund is established to cover program expenses as a means of reaching out to neighborhood youth, serving them by providing supplemental instruction in reading, mathematics, study skills, and fine arts within a Christ-centered setting. LSEM has expanded into nine states with similar programs.




