From the Pastor's Desk "The Co

So they called them and charged them not to speak or teach at all in the Name of Jesus. But Peter and John answered them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard." Acts 4:18-20

The Day of Pentecost will be celebrated this month; the day the Church remembers the dramatic arrival of the Holy Spirit, and how He motivated the disciples to share the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ with "all nations."

And if you've been following current events lately — with all of the "bathroom confusion" and political maneuvering — it makes me wonder if the Church could use another Pentecost today to spur the Gospel message among us.

In the Civil War most regiments had a ten-man honor guard, which carried the flags of country and unit into battle.

Not surprisingly, carrying something as conspicuous as these great flags made the soldier an immediate target for the enemy. Battlefield records tell us how one carrier of the flag after another could be shot. The colors would wobble, and the next member of the guard would grab it and continue on.

It was an honor to carry those flags, if even for a very short time.

On occasion, all of the color guard would be killed or wounded, but there's no record that speaks of a charge being stopped while officers searched for volunteers. Volunteers were always at the ready because they knew it was an honor to carry the flag.

Go to the bloodied battlefield of Gettysburg (as our ILS 7th and 8th-graders do every other year) and see — placed in display cases of honor the colors of these regiments, ripped and torn by

shot and shell, baptized by the blood of men, who had made a commitment to a cause that changed the world.

As great as the cause of freedom was, it pales in comparison to God's cause to free souls from the slavery of sin, death and Satan.

Christians should remember it's an honor to share the cross of Christ with a sinful world. Because of the Savior's innocent life, suffering, death and glorious resurrection from the dead, we've been given a message that can change the world. But we need to remember how easily other things can get in the way of the church moving forward in the sharing of that message.

We need to remember those things, and we need to avoid them.

To carry the colors — the cross of Christ — is the honor the Savior has given to every generation of the church. Some decades have carried those colors well and souls have been won; others have failed and the advancement of the message has almost faltered.

Now you and I are not responsible for what's happened in the past, and we're not entirely responsible for what happens in the future, but this is our time to do what we can, where we can, in the sharing of the Redeemer's Name.

As the disciples said, "We cannot help but speak of those things which we have seen and heard and touched."

THE PRAYER: Dear Lord, send the Holy Spirit upon the church and upon us. Grant us the courage, the wisdom, the words, to share the story of salvation with a lost and sinful world. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

LWML NEW ENGLAND DISTRICT CONVENTION

LWML New England District President Leslie Colligan presided over her final convention in New London, Connecticut on April 8-9. With 100 assembled around the theme "Still Quenched by the Water", convention activities included Bible study, mission speakers, worship services, district business, and the election of the district's new LWML President, Barbara Lis.

Mission Grants for the 2016-2018 biennium were chosen:

Immanuel Lutheran School will receive \$5,000 for financial assistance.

Hands of Grace in New Hartford, CT will receive **\$4,000** to purchase food from the Connecticut Food Bank.

The New England Branch of **Orphan Grain Train** had been selected to receive the **Gifts from the Heart**. The women of LWML were very generous with their donations; a large truck was filled with their contributions.

LWML MISSION GRANT

OUTREACH IN REFUGEE CAMPS—LEBANON \$72,000

The mite offerings of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League support the Outreach in Refugee Camps in Lebanon. Muslim Women and children fleeing from war, famine and death, are provided with humanitarian supplies, outreach meetings and events, but the most important of all, a long term growth and expansion of the Gospel, so that they can improve their lives.

Middle East Lutheran Ministry (MELM) is doing an extraordinary job with the many displaced people in Lebanon, as they look at the physical and spiritual needs of those in the refugee camps. Facing extreme religious violence, displacement and rejection, this program enables the team to share the faith and true love of Jesus Christ. Supported by a mission grant from the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, MELM will truly rescue women and children, including widows and orphans, at a time of desperate needs and hopelessness, by giving them a strong Christian presence as the gospel is being shared with them.

BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER

A Baby Bottle Fundraiser is a fun way for families to participate in crisis pregnancy ministry. The Crisis Pregnancy Center (CPC) in Unionville is a nonprofit, volunteer, Christian agency committed to assisting women in crises due to pregnancy by providing emotional support and practical assistance. Baby bottles will be handed out on Mother's Day, May 8th, for you to take home, fill with pocket change and return on Father's Day, June19th.



THE IMMANUEL LUTHERAN FOUNDATION Call For Grant and Scholarship Applications

The Immanuel Lutheran Foundation has been serving diverse needs of the Immanuel Lutheran Church since 1997. Thanks to several generous gifts, it has provided financial support to do those important things we never seemed to have the money for. Most were small in comparison to Immanuel's million-dollar budget but they all answered a real need.

Since that first year, over \$180,000 in Fund earnings has been given out through a grant application process to members, boards, and organizations of Immanuel to allow them to better serve our Lord through Immanuel's Local ministries. This while preserving the Fund's operating principal even in the difficult investment times we find ourselves in today.



All this for one reason:

To provide continuing support for the Ministry of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through the Immanuel Lutheran Church here in Bristol. While the Foundation's General Fund earnings are directed to the support of *non-budgeted items*, the earnings of the Westfall Endowment Funds administered by Foundation Directors are directed to specific needs; supporting pastoral continuing education, scholarships for Immanuel's members entering the "Preaching and Teaching" ministries of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, local expenses, school expenses, and the maintenance and upkeep of Immanuel Lutheran Church. The Ruth Janning Endowment also administered by the Foundation provides funds to the church with their use directed by the Church Council to best serve this ministry.

2016 Grant Applications are being accepted now. Forms are available thru the Church Office and returned there when complete. Westfall Scholarship Applications are also available in the office.

The Directors begin the Grant Review Process in April and continue throughout the year as funding remains available. Westfall Scholarship applications accepted until June 15th.


