**From Pastor Karner's Desk**

**"The Unknown"**

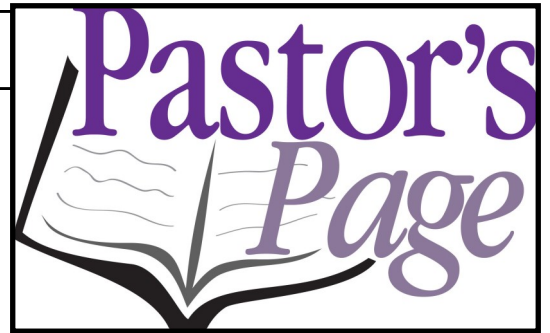
*No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:37-39*

The ancient Scottish (or Welsh) prayer reads, "From ghoulies and ghosties And long-leggedy beasties and things that go bump in the night, Good Lord, deliver us!"

Now the odds are the person who first wrote that prayer had never seen any ghoulies or ghosties. Nor is it likely he or she had had any encounters with long-leggedy beasties. Yet, that prayer has survived. It comes down to us partly because of its quaint language, but also because it touches something deep down inside all of us, namely, the fear of the unknown and the things we can't control.

"From ghoulies and ghosties and long-leggedy beasties And things that go bump in the night, Good Lord, deliver us!"

When European explorers set out across the sea that might well have been their prayer.



With only the basic navigational tools, and maps based on guesswork rather than fact, the unknown was a constant terror. But that kind of unknown has been taken care of by today's GPS, our global positioning systems.



Many of the past unknowns have been taken care of in the same way. Doppler radar means there are no more weather surprises, and the news lets us know when a flu epidemic is coming our way. Nowadays when something goes "bump in the night," it usually is the air-conditioner turning on.

Still, I imagine you could, without much difficulty, come up with your own list of ghoulies, ghosties and long-leggedy beasties this Halloween season. You wouldn't have to think long before you could come up with those unknowns, which rob you of sleep and cause you concern and consternation.



You know, things like "Is my job secure? Do I have enough to live on in retirement? Are my children safe? Is my spouse being faithful? What's the unknown lump on my back?"

**Proverbs 16:6 - "Through love and faithfulness, sin is atoned for; Through the fear of the Lord a man avoids evil."**

Then, of course, there's the ever-present "What will happen to me after I die?"

Life provides us a laundry-list of unknowns that modern science and the complete library of human knowledge can't touch. That's why we need Someone who has the answers and the authority to help us deal with these unknowns.

From what I can see, the only Person who has the qualifications to answer that job description is Jesus, the Savior. Only He can provide peace for those who find themselves confronted by the questions a sinful world throws at us. Only He has faced and conquered death so that all who believe on Him as their Savior can be sure and certain that the sting and victory of the grave have been removed.

Only He can deal with the unknown ghoulies, ghosties and long-leggedy beasties in every age and in every heart.

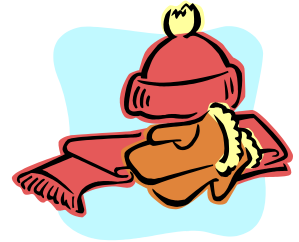

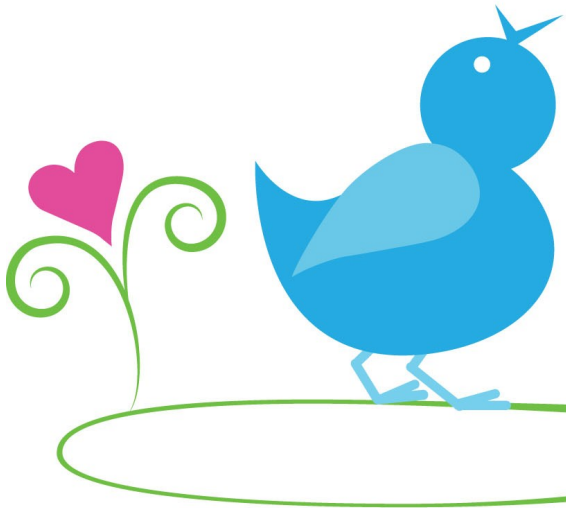
