**From the Pastor's Desk**

**“The Gospel Offense”**

*And blessed is the one who is not offended by me.* – Luke 7:23

What does it take for someone or something to offend you? Can you remember the last time you were genuinely offended? What caused it? How did it make you feel? Angry? Shocked? Vengeful? What was your response? Was it something like, “How dare you!”? “How dare you question my integrity!” “How dare you insult my intelligence!” “How dare you accuse me of wrongdoing!”

Our Lord Jesus was no stranger to “How dare you!” His earthly ministry lasted only three years, but it was enough time to offend all sorts of people in all sorts of ways. Some, like the Pharisees, were offended by Jesus because he threatened their authority and positions of power. Others, even some of his disciples, were offended because he disappointed them with the way he demonstrated his messianic calling. The Gospels record how, time and again, people were scandalized or offended by something Jesus said or did, or even by something he didn't do.

In Luke, chapter seven, Jesus responds by saying, “Blessed is the one who is not offended by me.”

Those words ring loud and clear even in our day, don't they? We live in a time and place where many are scandalized by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The offense of the Gospel is understandable, if not regrettable, among unbelievers. But the truth is, even those who profess themselves to be Christians can, at times, seem uncomfortable – even embarrassed – by the exclusive claims of Christianity.

We're all guilty. We've all acted as though Jesus was offensive to us. You can remember times when you failed to speak a corrective word to an erring brother. Or those

times we were too squeamish to defend our Christian beliefs when confronted by a neighbor, a co-worker, or a family member.

Why do we so often fail to let our Christian light shine before men? Are we afraid? Are we worried about what other people will think of us? Or is it that deep down inside we wonder whether or not we have any faith, let alone a faith that we can speak about and share with others?

In spite of our failures God speaks a word of benediction to us. “Blessed are you. Blessed are you – not because of anything you have (or haven't) done, but because of what I've done for you.

“I created you to be my own, and I've given you everything you need to support you in life. I redeemed you when you were a lost and condemned creature. I purchased and won you from all sin, from death, and from the power of the devil with my precious blood and my innocent suffering and death. I called you by the Gospel. I enlightened you with my gifts. And I have sanctified and kept you in the one true faith. All this I have done for you out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any required merit or worthiness on your part, so that on the Last Day I can raise you from the dead and give you eternal life.”

Blessed are those who are reminded of all their blessings. Rejoice! Blessed are you who have been washed clean in the waters of Holy Baptism. Rejoice! Blessed are you who hear the words of Absolution spoken to your troubled hearts. Rejoice! Blessed are you who receive the body and blood of our Lord for complete forgiveness.

Rejoice! Blessed are you who trust in God to be faithful – because he has been, is, and always will be! Rejoice! Amen.

### MISSION GRANT STORY

**Providing Food and the Gospel to Starving Children**

**Mercy Meals of Siouxland**

**\$40,000**

Jesus gives the same command today, to feed the hungry that He gave His disciples. Mercy Meals of Siouxland, a ministry of Faith Lutheran Church, Sioux City, Iowa, began packaging fortified rice/soy meals in 2012. Mercy Meals donates all packaged meals to Orphan Grain Train for transportation and delivery to Christian organizations in many countries, including India, Haiti, Romania, and Ecuador, as well as to Navajo reservations in the Southwest and Ysleta Mission in El Paso, Texas. Children and families receive food and hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. An LWML grant will feed from 50,000 to 75,000 hungry children.

WHEREAS, The Lord commanded the disciples to feed the hungry and make disciples of all nations; and

WHEREAS, As many as 14,000 children die each day of starvation in our world, most not knowing Our Lord; and

WHEREAS, Mercy Meals feed the body and the Gospel feeds the soul; and

WHEREAS, Donations are not fully funding the ministry of Mercy Meals of Siouxland at this time; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$40,000 to help fund Providing Food and the Gospel to Starving Children.

Dear Immanuel Lutheran Church Members and Friends,

Immanuel Lutheran School began the 2017-18 school year with 70 students enrolled. This is up from 52 last year at this time and is a 25% increase in back-to-school enrollment. We have several new families at the school and all have strong Christian backgrounds and strong moral character. Our focus on Christian values is appealing to these families.

New staff members for the 2017-18 school year include Mrs. Sandy Butler in the first-second grade classroom. Sandy was a called teacher at St. Matthew's Lutheran School in New Britain for 26 years. She is a wonderful addition to our staff. Her experience in a Lutheran education shines through. Miss Susan Szalkiewicz is teaching our fourth grade class. This is her first teaching position and her enthusiasm is contagious. Miss Carrie Blais is our new Physical Education teacher. She teaches on Mondays and Wednesdays and incorporates unique age-appropriate fitness activities into the lessons. Carrie, a Marine Corp Veteran, loves working with children. Immanuel Lutheran School is blessed to have these new additions.

Changes this year include Mr. Richard Carlson, our Middle School math teacher, taking on grades 5 and 6 as well. Students in grades 5-8 will be offered world language of their choice. Sports are back at Immanuel! Mr. Carlson is coaching the Immanuel Lutheran Golf Team, and other sports are in the works.

Volunteers are needed at the school and at school events. The Run for Reformation 5K is planned for October 29 at 1:00. Proceeds will go toward technology advancements for the school. These include devices, internet connectivity, and teacher training.

We are blessed at Immanuel. We have wonderful children, dedicated teachers, and active parents. It is truly a wonderful place to grow and learn.

### **Orphan Grain Train Makes A Shipment to Lithuania**

The Orphan Grain Train's (OGT) New England Branch, located in Terryville, Connecticut recently shipped a full container of needed clothing, tools, farm tools, bikes, toys, hygiene and school kits, and an altar and church pews to Lithuania on June 16, 2017.

This was the 13<sup>th</sup> shipment since the Branch was dedicated as the 23<sup>rd</sup> in the country for OGT on June of 2014. Shipments have gone to a number of other countries such as Ghana, Liberia, Nicaragua, Ukraine, Moldova, Nepal, the Philippines and Latvia. The Branch also helps those locally, giving medical items that have been donated to individuals in need and thru the visiting nurse and hospice care organizations of the area. It has also helped with a shipment to the Bridgeport Rescue Mission.

After loading, the full containers are trailered to a port for sea transport to their destination. All items have been donated by individuals or organizations and all funds used to support these efforts are donated as well, as is the time of the volunteers. Mr. Bill Allread has made space available in his warehouse at 33 S. Main St. in Terryville to support these ministry outreach efforts.
