## From the Pastor's Desk "Learning and Listening"

Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to Your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of Your goodness, O LORD! Psalm 25:7

In 2015, Malachi Bradley was only 10 years old.

Even so, he possessed two qualities that often elude those who are many times his age. His story is an interesting one.

Bradley was out camping with his family at a mountain lake in a remote area of Utah. He'd been learning about mushrooms and was so caught up in the desire to find new specimens he wandered away from the group. Unfortunately, he wandered so far away that when he finally looked up he had no idea of his whereabouts.

Realizing he was going to spend a frigid night in the mountains alone, Bradley remembered some of the survival skills his father had taught him. Thinking quickly, he found, and curled up between two large rocks that had absorbed the day's heat. The next day when Bradley heard a plane fly overhead, he realized he couldn't be seen in a heavily treed area. Quickly, he found an open meadow and there he waited until a helicopter arrived to rescue him.

Thinking about the events of the previous days, Bradley said he'd go camping again, but things would be different. Things will be different, because "I'll learn from my mistakes."

At the beginning I said Bradley had two important and admirable qualities. Have you been able to identify them? The first is probably obvious: he said he learns from his mistakes. Looking back at my life and the lives of many people whom I know, learning from past mistakes is an elusive attribute.

All too easily, past temptations become present temptations, and past sins end up being repeated over and over again. Just like the apostle Paul, "I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing" (Romans 7:19). Our inability to learn from past mistakes and our continuous sinning takes us to Malachi's second good quality. He was saved from trouble and tragedy because he had listened to his father.

A wise Christian follows Malachi's example and listens to his Heavenly Father. And what does the Heavenly Father tell us? On the Mount of Transfiguration, He said Jesus "... is My beloved Son; listen to Him" (Mark 9:7b). We should listen to Jesus when He says,

\* He is "... the Way, and the Truth, and the Life ...." (John 14:6b).

\* He is the resurrection and the life and with faith in Him as Savior, we will never die (see John 11:25).

\* He is the Good Shepherd who lays down and picks up His life again, so the sheep might be saved (see John 10:11-18).

There you have it: a 10-year-old boy shows us we should learn from past mistakes and urges us to listen to our Heavenly Father. If we follow Malachi, many of us will be ahead of the game.

THE PRAYER: Dear Lord, grant us the grace to learn from our mistakes and listen to You who calls us to the Savior's blood-bought forgiveness and salvation. In Jesus' Name we pray it. Amen. Pastor Karner


### CALLED HOME TO HEAVEN

## **FELLOWSHIP REMEMBERED – Chapter 5**

Just to give you the scope of the food we consumed at our chicken bar-b-ques here is the menu from September 1, 1980. 69 adults and 5 children attended.

- 7 dozen silver queen corn on the cob
- 62 drumstick/thigh combinations
- 20 breasts

40 wings (we need to order more for next year as appetizers)

The minutes of November, 1980, contain a small error.

"The AF helped with preparing, serving and cleaning up for the most successful (1<sup>st</sup> annual Sauerkraut Supper) [in October of 1961, I vividly remember smelling sauerkraut all day long in my class-room in the Original School and coming that evening to a packed basement with the ladies of the church preparing and serving the supper. As I was told, that was one of many sauer-kraut suppers held in the school basement during our history.] "Santa visited the Harvest Festival booths which included baked goods, hot dogs, craft items, plants, tag sale items, Christian Mart materials, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders selling oranges and grapefruit."

Over \$3000 was raised for the Building Fund"

In February of 1981 "A large crowd gathered in the gym for slides and movies about the **church renovation and** 'raising the new steeple'

In addition there was much good food, volley-ball, cards, Backgammon, Scrabble and other 'quiet' games".
