Item List for Orphan Grain Train New England – A Future Shipment Potentially to Moldova (Aid for the Refugees)

- **Non-perishable food** (Please note that it will need to expire at least 18 months in the future. Recommend only collecting processed rice meals.)
- **Hygiene kits** (even incomplete kits)
- Blankets/quilts
- **Linens** prefer twin size and pillowcases.
- **Clothing:** men's, women's, and children's note that items for children under age 3 are PROHIBITED in Moldova. *Please make sure to pack infant/toddler clothing separately from the children's clothing.*
- **Shoes:** men's, women's, and children's
- Diapers for adults and infants
- Sanitary napkins and feminine hygiene kits
- Towels
- Canes: crutches, walkers, and wheelchairs
- Bicvcles
- School kits
- Sewing machines
- **Sports equipment** balls

The cost to ship a container to Moldova is around \$15,000. If your desire is to make a financial donation, make check payable to: Orphan Grain Train. On the memo line write: "For Refugees."

From the Pastor's Desk

"The Final Word Isn't Death!"

So, she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put Him!" John 20:2

"El Cid" is the 1,000-year-old story of Rodrigo Diaz, a Spanish knight who almost single-handedly saved the kingdom of Spain from the Moors. The movie itself is based on truth. It spoke the truth when it showed El Cid's victories. It told the truth when it showed his death and how his generals tried to pretend he was still alive. The movie accurately showed how they dressed his body in armor, strapped him to his horse, and tied a sword into his hand. Then it showed the body of the dead leader, charging out of the gates of the city, leading his men against the enemy.

The movie is quite accurate ... up to that point. But then, in a desire for a happy ending, the movie begins to lie, showing the Spanish forces in the lead routing the frightened Moors. But it didn't happen that way – the dead body fooled no one. The charge failed, and the defeated Spaniards ran away. They found out that a dead man is a poor leader.

In contrast, Christians follow a living Lord. Almost 2,000 years ago, Jesus was crucified. Tens of thousands had been crucified before Him, but only Jesus – unexpectedly, unbelievably – came back to life. Because He did, the world is changed. Those who believe on Jesus as their living Lord are confident that death doesn't have the final word in their lives. Those who put their hope and their futures into the nail-pierced

hands of the risen Savior, know they will never be alone, and that nothing in this world can separate them from the love of God that has come to them through Christ Jesus.

Christ is risen! Yes, we know that sort of thing doesn't happen ... can't happen. But because Jesus was the sinless Son of God, He didn't have our limitations. Jesus did rise. In the days that followed, Jesus' friends saw Him, ate with Him, talked with Him, touched Him. Not just once, but numerous times. This, the most wonderful event in the history of the world, cannot be denied. Jesus lives and, because He does, we know we follow a living Lord. This is the truth that has changed the world and, ... your life.

THE PRAYER: Risen Lord, open our eyes to all of your blessings today, so that our hearts may overflow with thanksgiving. Our hope and future rest safely in Your nail-pierced hands, and we rejoice in the knowledge that nothing in this world can separate us from the love of our living Lord. Amen.

THE IMMANUEL LUTHERAN FOUNDATION Call for Grant and Scholarship Applications

Thanks to a generous gift, the Immanuel Lutheran Foundation has been serving diverse needs of the Immanuel Lutheran Church since 1997. This "General Fund" has provided financial support through a Grant Application Process to do those important "non-budgeted" things "for which we never seemed to have the money."

While the Foundation's General Fund earnings are directed to the support of *non-budgeted items*, the earnings of the Westfall Endowment Funds established some years later are directed to specific needs. These include; local expenses, school expenses, and the maintenance and upkeep of Immanuel Lutheran Church. Provisions have also been made to award five scholarships each year. IMMANUEL GETS A NEW STEEPLE

The steeple that adorned our church when it was built was supported by large wooden beams. These were the state of the art and all believed they would last forever.

However, water and age took their toll and concerns were voiced that we might some day find the steeple in the middle of West Street during a particularly strong wind storm.

In 1981 research was done and a builder from down south was selected to design and build a steeple that looked as close to the original one as possible.

A concrete base was poured at the top of the rectangular tower under the steeple with a series of very large bolts embedded.

The pictures, taken on a slushy January day in 1981 from the steps of St. Ann's Church, show the steeple arriving and being hoisted into place. It was secured with very large nuts.

Dear Immanuel Lutheran Church Members and Friends.

We love March at Immanuel Lutheran School! We have had four full uninterrupted weeks of academic and spiritual growth! The month included Dr. Seuss Day. Staff and students dressed Seussically to celebrate the well-loved Lutheran children's author.



Every day at Immanuel Lutheran School starts with a morning opening for grades 1-8. We say the pledges, share a verse, make announcements, and pray. Students are reminded daily to keep the people of Ukraine in their prayers. The students are giving \$1,000 of their chapel offerings to the LCMS humanitarian efforts in Ukraine.

Spring field trips are as follows: PK3 - Flamig Farm, PK4 - KidsPlay (Torrington), Kindergarten - Indian Rock, Grades 1-3 - CT Science Center, and Grades 4 through 8 - Old Sturbridge Village. Most of these trips are in late May. PTO is paying for the buses and all entry fees.

Our PK children have been excited to participate in Soccer Shots after school in the gym on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The four-week program teaches children basic skills with trained instructors. A Soccer Shots program for Kindergarten and 1st graders begins after Easter.

Our Little Lamb's program is full once again. We have filled three classrooms and have started a waitlist. A 4th classroom will open soon, the current music room, which will make the entire middle floor the Little Lambs Learning Center.

Susan Schneider will be starting Monday, April 4, as the Director of Preschool and Camps. Susan comes to us from a center in Avon, where she has been for fifteen years. She served there as the director, and also directed the center's two satellite locations in Canton and Bloomfield. If you get the chance to meet Susan, you will be very impressed. She has a child-centered approach and gentle manner that will benefit our program.

Pictured are some of our Kindergarten and 1st grade boys waiting for the bus at the end of the school day. These boys will be young men before we know it, with Christian values to model for their own families. Seeds of love and hope are planted everyday at Immanuel Lutheran School!


