

From the Pastor's Desk "A Sneeze and A Blessing"

Oh, give thanks to the LORD; call upon His Name; make known His deeds among the peoples! Sing to Him, sing praises to Him; tell of all His wondrous works! Glory in His Holy Name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice!

1 Chronicles 16:8-10

A few years ago, a professor at the University of Texas Rio Grand Valley made a decision. That decision was made plain to his students through the course syllabus. And what was that decision? The professor decreed that students were to refrain from using the term "God bless you." The ban was in effect during all of his classes and tests.

It was an order that upset some of the students who felt it was a violation of their freedom of religion; others thought their prof was just being pretty picky. It didn't take too long for the professor's rule to go viral.

So strong was the reaction in the general public, the University jumped on in with an explanation. It said, "The intent was not to limit the religious freedoms of students but to avoid unsolicited comments that might distract others." That could make sense if the professor had also said saying, "Gesundheit!" was unacceptable, or "Up your nose with a rubber hose!" or any of a thousand other disruptive things people might say.

Nope, the professor only forbade his students from saying, "God bless you." To make a long story short, the prof eventually took that line out of his course syllabus. That's fantastic.




The Immanuel Lutheran Church Digital Photography Club Some of Us Like to Tinker.

Why should I use Post-Processing software to enhance my photos?

I get good pictures right out of my camera!

Electronic image sensors in today's digital cameras are pretty amazing. They can produce excellent photos. If you're happy with the results right out of camera, it's a Success!!

Most serious hobbyists and likely all pro photographers would argue that out-of-camera photos do benefit from post-processing to make each photo "all it can be." It starts with sharpening, color and light adjustments, cropping, tweaking the highlights, maybe upping the vibrance, and more. Keep going and real magic can happen ... just don't go too far. Some call post-processing essential, some call it creative. It's usually both. Others call it *"Tinkering."*

Dear Immanuel Lutheran Church Members and Friends,

Our nine weeks of Camp Immanuel concluded on August 19. All sessions were well attended and the children enjoyed their time with the staff and each other.

The Immanuel Lutheran School is back in session Wednesday, August 31. We currently have 145 students registered for the upcoming year. A Meet the Teacher event is scheduled for Monday, August 29, from 5:30-7:00 PM. Families will be able to meet their teachers, see their classrooms, find their lockers and walk through their schedule.

We have a wonderful staff. The skills and talents they bring allow us to offer an enriching curriculum while teaching them about God's love. This year we are adding introductory world languages at the elementary level. Students in grades 1-4 will learn French, Spanish, Italian and German. Students in grades 5-8 will receive half a year of French and half a year of Spanish with a splash of Italian. We are also maintaining our Engineering class at the middle school level.

As the school has been closed off to visitors due to covid, we are opening all of the classrooms for members to view after the service on Sunday, August 28. Teachers will not be present, but their classrooms will be ready. The teaching line-up for the 2022-2023 school year is below.
